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* The majority of undergraduate programs are taught in Italian, only a very limited number are taught in English. The majority of master's programs are taught in Italian. However a fair number of them are taught in English.

Students including only course units taught in Italian in their Learning agreements must have a minimum level of language competence corresponding to A2.

Students including course units taught in English in their learning agreement must have a minimum level of language competence corresponding to B1.

Those who will select units taught in English and units taught in Italian must meet the requirements of both languages.

Staff level:

Staff will be proficient in the working language of the receiving Department/School. Generally English is the working language, therefore a fair knowledge of this language will be required. Candidate's language competence will be assessed by the supervisor of the host institution who will write a Support Letter in favor of the candidate. The Support Letter is to be included by the candidate in her/his Application dossier. For further details about the Support Letter please see the "Vademecum for Promotion, Application, Evaluation and Selection process" (Annex III of the Inter-institutional agreement).

B. ANY ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate and Master students will normally be permitted to enter all available courses (except for Medicine, Physiotherapy and Dentistry) at I BOLOGNA01 unless these courses are subject to restricted enrolments. The following are the main restrictions:

- some of the English taught programmes have restricted enrolment, exchange is possible only after the School has approved the mobility plan of the nominee;
- Medicine, Physiotherapy and Dentistry are not open to exchange;
- the School of Economics, Management and Statistics admits at master level only graduate students: undergraduates cannot attend as exchange student master courses offered by this School;
- professional masters are not open to exchange.



Incoming Students and Staff at I BOLOGNA01 will be selected by their Home University according to the flows established in Part B of the Inter-institutional agreement. The Partner will comply with the principles of a fair and effective selection process described in the "Vademecum for Promotion, Application, Evaluation and Selection process", Annex III of the Inter-institutional agreement. Selected students and Staff will be nominated by their Home University and I BOLOGNA01 will accept the nominations as long as these fully meet the requirements set by the present agreement. Selected students will not have to submit any further application.

C. NOMINATION/ACCEPTANCE SCHEDULE AND ACADEMIC CALENDARS

Undergraduate and Master students Nomination/Acceptance Schedule:

1. Undergraduate and Master students can begin their mobility in the first or in the second term of the 2017/2018 academic year in accordance with the start of the courses:
 - a. first term: between September and October 2017;
 - b. second term: between February and March 2018.

Dates of the academic calendar will be communicated to the nominated students once available.

2. Undergraduate and Master students' nominations must reach I BOLOGNA01 by:
 - a. 30th May 2017: for students willing to carry out the mobility in the first term
 - b. 31st October 2017: for students willing to carry out the mobility in the second term.

Nominations will be communicated by the Partner Contact Office via e-mail to diri.area3@unibo.it. The Partner will provide together with the Nominations the documents of the Application dossier considered "minimum required" as defined in the "Vademecum for Promotion, Application, Evaluation and Selection process".

3. I BOLOGNA01 will send its decision on admission within five weeks upon receipt of nominations.
4. A Transcript of Records will be issued by I BOLOGNA01 no later than 5 weeks after student departure.

Undergraduate and Master students' Academic Calendar:

- First term start: September/October 2017. Each School has its own starting date generally scheduled within the beginning of September and the beginning of October.
- Examinations: January - February 2018. Each School sets its own examinations dates within this window.
- Christmas break: December 24, 2017 – January 8, 2018
- Second term start: February/March 2018. Each School has its own starting date generally scheduled within the beginning of February and the beginning of March.
- Examinations: June – July 2018. Each School sets its own examinations dates within this window.
- Mobility must be completed by July 31st, 2018



Staff Nomination/Acceptance Schedule:

1. Staff can start their mobility at any time in accordance with the academic calendar and official breaks. Mobility period must be agreed with the Host Supervisor. In all cases the mobility must be completed by July 31st, 2018.
2. Nominations will be communicated by the Partner Contact Office via e-mail to diri.area3@unibo.it), at least 3 months prior to the beginning of the mobility so that nominees will be able to reach Bologna in the scheduled time. For each nominee the Partner will provide the Support Letter issued by the Host Supervisor at I BOLOGNA01. The Support Letter is the same document the candidate has enclosed in her/his Application as described in the "Vademecum for Promotion, Application, Evaluation and Selection process".
3. I BOLOGNA01 will send its decision on admission within five weeks upon receipt of nominations and Support letters.
4. A Confirmation of Achievements/Confirmation of Participation will be issued by I BOLOGNA01 no later than 5 weeks after student departure.

Staff Academic Calendar:

the mobility period must be agreed with the prospective Host Supervisor in accordance with the plan of activities.

Unless there is a strong academic reason I BOLOGNA01 discourages any mobility during the Summer break (June, July and August)

D. INFORMATION

D.1. Multi-campus structure

I BOLOGNA01 has 5 Campuses located in 5 different towns of the Emilia-Romagna region: Bologna (headquarter), Forlì, Cesena, Rimini e Ravenna.

D.2. Credit and Grading systems of the institutions

Credits for Undergraduate and Master level:

1 CFU* = 1 ECTS = 25 hours of total workload (classes + individual work + assignments, etc)

1 academic year = 60 CFU; 1 term = 30 CFU

In order to get a Bachelor degree (1st cycle) a student must earn 180 CFU.

In order to get a Master degree (2nd cycle) a student must earn 120 CFU.

*CFU = credito formativo universitario = university course credit

Grades for Undergraduate and Master level:

0 – 17/30 = failed

First passing grade = 18/30

18/30 – 30/30 = passed

If you obtain full grade (30/30) the examination board may also decide to award you honours (lode): 30/30L



For some activities, particularly language exams (including those for the Italian language course) and for some internship activities, you will not be given a grade but merely a "Idoneo"/"Pass".

Incoming exchange scholars do not receive credits neither grades.
